I hope this note finds you all well. Here in Maine the trees have begun to bloom and the bird chirp a promise of the warmth to soon arrive.

Today I write to you 1700 days into the Heart of America Quilt. Before my update this newsletter, I had to sit back in my old creaking office chair and ponder what has been done, how and what it has done for our country and world. There is no sensible reason why hundreds of thousands of people from all over the world, from all walks of life would put such effort forth; no sensible reason, of course, except sheer human kindness and compassion. I am often told I see the world through rose colored glasses and I smile. Maybe I do. Fortunately for me, I have seen the proof. On September 10th 2006, I will have the chance, the opportunity, the privilege of sharing that proof with many people at the Capital Reflecting Pool in Washington D.C. With our honorable Directors, Advisors and many wonderful volunteers, we will display for our country to see what can be done when we work together.

Last month I was privileged to meet with our Directors in our Nations Capitol. While much time was spent conversing about logistics and fabric and how we could best help everyone get to DC that longed to be there, I drifted for a moment. Watching these people that have donated their time over the past few years to tend to the working of the Quilt was amazing. I sat in the meeting room with a Master Chief in the United States Navy, A survivor of 9/11 from the Pentagon and a true American Patriot and business owner; all of us different, but with a single goal.

That goal will come to fruition. Near the five-year anniversary of September 11th, the Heart of America Quilt will show a 1/2 acre of red, white and blue in a location perfectly worthy of its voice of unity. Three of the directors and I stood on the grassy location and looked up at the United States Capitol building that will be the back drop of this showing. We were all left breathless


The K-3 activity book is designed to teach students about the importance of community service through activities like coloring, drawing and connect-the-dots and actual community involvement.

Advisor Notes...


Dear friends of Heart of America Quilt,
I currently serve on the Board of Advisors for the Heart of America Quilt, Inc. The Quilt is a means to help those affected by the events of 9/11 and to teach children to heal and help in a simple manner. This organization began on September 13, 2001 with a panel of handprints and signatures from Mount Merici School in Waterville, Maine. Within weeks of its inception, the Heart of America Quilt grew to the National level. At present, the Quilt includes panels from each of the United States as well as 9/11 survivors, families of 9/11 victims and other fine organizations and individuals. Other countries have added to the Quilt as well giving it International reach. Canada, India, Iraq, England, France, Germany, Australia, South Africa, Ireland, France and Switzerland have all added signatures to join in the unity.
We are organizing a showing of the Quilt in Washington D.C. to commemorate the fifth anniversary of the attacks on 9/11 and promote community involvement and awareness. We have filed papers with the Department of the Interior, Parks Department for a permit to display the quilt at the National Mall in September 2006. In order for the September 2006 showing to occur, we need your assistance.
