Along with our Team Unity we are working to raise funding for a television show to premier in Maine and grow to include national visits that will showcase these children and thank them for the work they do to make their communities and our country an even better place.

The President's Volunteer Service Award

Heart of America Quilt has awarded volunteers with the President's Volunteer Service Award, a national honor offered in recognition of volunteer service.



Established in 2003, the Award is available on an annual basis to individuals, groups and families who have met or exceeded requirements for volunteer service and have demonstrated exemplary citizenship through volunteering. As one of hundreds of Certifying Organizations participating in the Award program, Heart of America Quilt confers the award to recognize the outstanding achievements of its volunteers.

Heart of America Quilt has a long history of volunteer service, and more than 200 volunteers perform community service each year on behalf of the organization. Volunteers from across the country are working for the Heart of America Quilt in many forms of community involvement.

In his 2002 State of the Union Address, President George W. Bush created the USA Freedom Corps, and called on every American to make a lifelong commitment to volunteer service. The President's Volunteer Service Award recognizes individuals and families who have answered that call.

America's volunteers work to make our communities stronger and safer. As a Certifying Organization for the Award program, Heart of America Quilt is proud to be aligned with this prestigious volunteer award, and we are especially proud of our volunteers who have made volunteer service a central part of their lives.

The President's Volunteer Service Award is an award for volunteer service that every American – from every age and every walk of life – can aspire to achieve. To be eligible to receive the Award, individuals, families and groups submit a record of their annual volunteer service hours to participating

Recipients of the President's Volunteer Service Award are role models for all Americans. Volunteers bring us closer together as families, as communities and as a Nation, through their commitment to helping others.

The Award is issued by the President's Council on Service and Civic Participation, a group created by President Bush to recognize the many valuable contributions volunteers are making to our Nation.

Chaired by two-time Super Bowl Champion Darrell Green, with former U.S. Senators Bob Dole and John Glenn as honorary co-chairs, the Council comprises leaders in government, media, entertainment, business, education, nonprofits and volunteer service organizations, and community volunteering.

Fun Facts

Why are community services important to you and your community?

1. 73% of America's 60 million young people believe they can make a difference in their communities. (Do Something Young People's Involvement Survey /Princeton Survey Research, 1998)
2. Teenagers volunteer 2.4 billion hours annually. (Independent Sector/Gallup, 1996)
3. Teenage service is worth \$34.3 billion to the US economy. (Independent Sector/Gallup, 1999 value of service)
4. Youth who volunteer just one hour a week are 50% less likely to abuse drugs, alcohol, cigarettes, or engage in destructive behavior. (Search Institute, 1995)
5. Youth who volunteer are more likely to do well in school, graduate, vote, and be philanthropic. (UCLA/Higher Education Research Institute, 1991)
6. The value of service carried out on National Youth Service Day exceeds \$171 million. (Youth Service America estimates based on Independent Sector value of service, 1999)
7. Youth who volunteer are three times more likely to volunteer as adults. (Independent Sector/Gallup, 1996)
8. Teens say the benefits received from volunteering are: Learning to respect others; learning to be helpful and kind; learning to understand people who are different from them; developing leadership skills, becoming more patient, and acquiring a better understanding of good citizenship. (Independent Sector/Gallup, 1996)
