what my plans are for 9/11 of this year. I explained that I would be working via the internet on our 'Have you forgotten' project. I was speaking to Alan Wallace. His story is on our home page. He was working outside of the Pentagon on 9/11 and in many of the photos of the building that day; you will see the destroyed fire truck that he was standing beside when the plane hit. Alan spoke with sadness in his voice and told me that for the first time since 9/11 he would be staying home as well. I plan to call Alan on 9/11 just to let him know that he is not forgotten. My heart was heavy with his call and I was consumed with sadness wondering if we were doing enough, if we could do more.

I then received an email from our Advisor, Linda Rapacki. Linda worked at NYMEX and will be attending their service this year. She brought tears to my eyes when she stated "The news papers will be full of tributes and there will be a silence over the city for a short time and the day will pass but the void will never go away nor will your beautiful quilt". How humbling to know that our small contribution is a symbol of unity that you all have helped to create a team effort legacy for generations to come and proof that our country stands as one when there is a need.

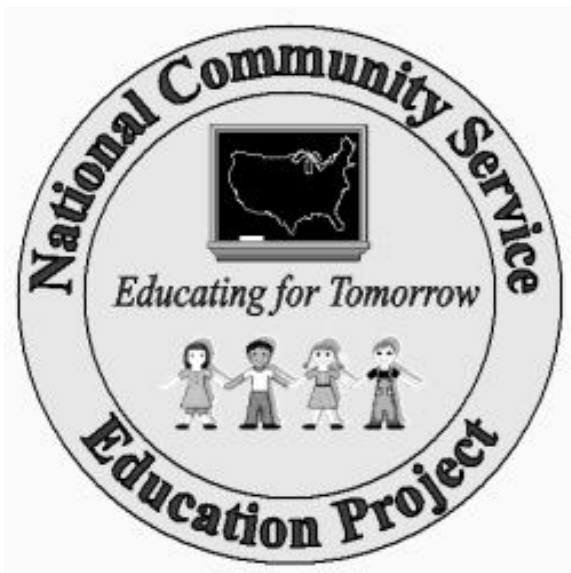

Director Tamera Selhaver interviewed-

I interviewed 9/11 survivor, Tamera Selhaver. Tamera is one of the survivors of the 9/11 attack. She was in the Pentagon, right above where the plane hit.

Chris: Can you describe where you were located in the Pentagon on 9/11/2001?

Tamera: Our office was the main area hit by the plane as it slammed into the building at corridor E and then into D and finally slid under us, killing our colleagues on the first floor. Our office area(second floor) fell into the first floor.

Chris: What do you remember about the attack itself?

Tamera: The noise happened, darkness happened, and I woke up to lots of screaming happening.

Chris: What did you do after the plane hit?

Tamera: I woke up after hearing someone yelling for myself and my two colleagues Sean and Scott (we never found that person and can only assume it was God). I was in my chair but on my back so I crawled out of it on my hands and knees. I couldn't figure out where I was so I just started screaming for Sean and Scott until they could locate my hand in the dark. We got out of the room after crawling over

fallen computer equipment, holes in the floor, and zapping wires hanging down every where.

After that we got out into the corridor, looked towards ring E and were shocked to see the blanket of black smoke. Injured soldiers were running our way so we headed towards the inner circle of the Pentagon and out into the courtyard then out of the Pentagon via one of the many alleys. The courtyard was not a pretty site, lots of injured people, blood and vomit, crying and screaming.

Chris: What were you doing when the plane hit?

Tamera: It all started with a whirring noise, my desk flew up in front of me, and I was pushed back into my chair and off into space (which must've been the floor dropping).

Chris: Do you remember any sounds?

Tamera: Unfortunately, all of them. I recall the whirring noise, the incredible screams for God, my own screams for my colleagues, and lots of crying.

Chris: Do you remember any smells?

Tamera: Jet fuel.

Chris: How does it feel to know you are a living part of United States History?

Tamera: I have never considered myself that way! I feel like such a tiny, non-significant little fleck of a speck. I pray that my mind keeps most of this in memory as it keeps me thankful for being an American.

Tamera has taught me about 9/11. She has become an example of perseverance to me and the United States. I feel very proud to know her and glad that she shared about her memory of 9/11. She will make sure that no one forgets that day. I think we are all lucky to be American beside her. Chris
